- Section 115.807(4), Wis. Statutes, which was created through 2017 Wisconsin Act 345, requires local education agencies (LEAs) to provide students and their parents with information on supported decision-making under Chapter 52 of the Wisconsin Statutes, other alternatives to guardianship, and strategies to remain engaged in the student's secondary education. This memorandum answers questions related to supported decision-making agreements to assist LEAs in providing this information to students and their families. <https://dpi.wi.gov/sped/laws-procedures-bulletins/bulletins/19-01>
- From the DPI Bulletin: 8. How should supported decision-making agreements be included when the student reaches the age of 18?

When a student with a disability, other than a student with a disability who has been adjudicated incompetent, reaches the age of 18, the LEA must notify the adult student and their parents of the transfer of rights. In addition, the LEA must provide the adult student and their parents with information on supported decision-making agreements, other alternatives to guardianship, and strategies to remain engaged in the adult student's secondary education (Wis. Stats. §115.807[4]).
