### What is the purpose of a PTP? - March 3, 2026

The Post-Secondary Transition Plan (PTP) is a part of the IEP that focuses on transition. The PTP looks at education or training, employment, and independent living (including health care) goals, as well as a student's preferences, interests, needs and strengths. It can be seen as a guide to moving from high school into adulthood.

### Getting Help as an Adult: Aging and Disability Resource Center - March 17, 2026

Learn what services the Aging and Disability Resource Center (ADRC) provides. The ADRC has been called the "gatekeeper" to adult long-term care programs. Find out when, why, and how you will need to connect with them, whether you are eligible for long-term care or not.

### Children's Long-Term Support programs - April 7, 2026

The Children's Long-Term Support (CLTS) Program helps children with disabilities and their families through supports and services that help children grow and live their best lives. We will learn how is eligible for CLTS and how do youth transition out of CLTS.

### Guardianship and Supported Decision-Making - April 14, 2026

There are steps to requesting guardianship and steps to implementing a Supported Decision-Making agreement. We will learn about what those steps are and provide resources to connect with.
